These are his most notable accomplishments. He was the longest serving president of the United States of America, serving a total of 3 almost 4 terms tragically dying from a cerebrovascular accident (CVA). He arrested the financial panic, also known as the Great Depression, through the Emergency Banking Act. He implemented Social Security for the first time in US History, as it was a part of his New Deal.² He played a major role in the creation of the United Nations. And lastly he was paralyzed from the waist down due to his Polio Disease.³

The Inaugural Speech:
Declared war on the Great Depression, set a precedent of hope and forward thinking as opposed to the nostalgic feeling associated with previous years Led into the golden years of America

FDR's involvement in the war. He built an incredibly strong wartime coalition with Great Britain and the Soviet Union, and he ultimately led the world to victory against Nazi Germany. His wartime efforts cleared an easy path for Truman to finish out the war by winning over Japan only 4 short months after he had passed.⁴ His inaugural speech was incredibly impactful in establishing himself as a forward thinking hopeful president, and he proved to be true as he led America out of the Great Depression, through a world war, and cleared the path for the most economically prosperous time in American History known simply as the 50's.⁵
